Dear Parents and families,

I can't believe it is nearly May already. This must mean that the SATs are getting closer in both Key Stages 1 and 2. The children have been busy developing their reading, writing and maths skills. Thank you to all the staff directly involved and those that have run a variety of focused intervention groups. I don't think we could do much more!

The term is well and truly into the swing of things with lots of exciting things happening. Please check the Diary Dates for all the things planned for the Summer Term. Please note that the Year 6 children will only attend the transition days of the school they will be going to in September.



### **SATs Week is coming**

The week beginning Monday 14<sup>th</sup> May is SATs week in school for our hard working Year 6 children. This is a statutory test of Reading, Spelling, Punctuation and Grammar and Maths, that all children around the country will be taking at the same time. We are very proud of our Year 6 children who have been working hard all year in preparation for these tests. They have been very well prepared and we ask that you make sure that they get a good night's sleep on Sunday, have a good breakfast and tackle these assessments with the same positive attitude that they have shown all year. I am sure that they will all do very well indeed. Good luck Year 6.

### **Other Assessments**

Pupils in Year 2 will complete statutory assessment tasks during the month of May but in a far less formal way. Pupils in Year 3, 4 and 5 will also be sitting the usual end of year assessment tests in the week beginning the 25<sup>th</sup> June. Children in Year 1 will complete a statutory phonics screening check in the week beginning 11<sup>th</sup> June.

### **Year 5 Class Assembly – ‘The Vikings Are Coming!’**

Well done to our Year 5 class for their assembly on the Vikings. They have put a lot of hard work into their performance and they gave us a lot of information about these raiders who eventually settled in Britain. I have to say that it was a little scary in parts.

Our Year 4 children will be going on their first residential to East Barnby for three days this coming Monday 30<sup>th</sup> April and returning on Wednesday 2<sup>nd</sup> May. This is the first time our Year 4's have gone on a residential and they are all up for the challenges of canoeing, climbing and beck scrambling to name but a few of the outdoor education opportunities. ### Leave Of Absence During Term Time

Can I remind parents that the Government's stance on holidays in term time remains unchanged and that they will, through the Local Authority, enforce a fixed penalty for 10 or more unauthorized sessions (5 days) at school unless it has been authorized by myself as 'exceptional circumstances'.

### Parking Around School

I continue to receive complaints from neighbours to the school about parking at the start and end of the day. I know how hectic it can be to get the kids to school in the morning, but in the interest of safeguarding our children and families, can I take this opportunity at the start of the summer term to be mindful of where you park near school. Many thanks.

### Dogs In School

If you walk your dog to school when dropping off your child please make sure that it is under control and tethered away from the school entrance. If you do leave your dog, you must be aware that it is your responsibility. It should also be mentioned that it is North Yorkshire Policy that no dogs are allowed onto the school premises for obvious reasons. The only exceptions are Guide dogs or dogs with appropriate risk assessments such as the Dogs In School charity which we have been involved with in the past.

### Cycling To School and Scooters

Can I remind parents of children wishing to bring bikes and scooters into school that they must complete a Cycling to School Request Form if they haven't already done so. You can get a form from me or at the office. Carefully read the conditions outlined on the form and return the completed request forms to me. I am happy for a child to come to school on a scooter provided that they walk the scooters when inside the school grounds. Please note that we only allow children in Year 3, 4, 5 and 6 to bring bikes and scooters to school.
