The Brilliant Book Bistro



A huge 'Well done!' to all of the children and staff in Key Stage 2 who have put on the 'Brilliant Book Bistro' on Wednesday and Thursday evening. There has been a huge amount of work gone into the planning and organization of the Bistro. The children have been responsible for the menus, the cooking and the serving of the food and have really tried their best to get it right for their parents. This has



been an excellent opportunity for our children to develop their enterprize skills for business people of the future, and develop cross-curricular links with other subjects. The profit made from the Brilliant Book Bistro will go towards a community project that the school has been working on – the Little Free Library. We will be building a community Little Free Library which will be situated just outside the school gate, at the Priest Close entrance. It will give everyone the opportunity to swap or borrow books and will be something we know the children of our school will take pride in.

Crucially, it will help to promote the reading of books and has supported our current Big Buzz topic about being an Active Citizen.

Primary Science Quality Mark (PSQM) – Silver Award

In March 2017 we enrolled on the Primary Science Quality Mark. It is a nationally recognized standard which schools can achieve if they satisfy very challenging criteria linked to school development and the quality of science teaching. We wanted to raise the profile of science across the school and give this important core subject the status it deserves. I am very pleased to say that we were told on the 14th May that we had been awarded the PSQM Silver Award. We are now very much a 'science school', where science sits at the heart of our broad curriculum. We are also 'well chuffed'!!



Year 1 and Year 2 Swimming



We are very lucky that an increase recently in the Sports Premium given to all schools has doubled to approximately £18000. This has meant that we took the unusual step of introducing swimming to our Year 1 and Year 2 children. It has been an incredible success. I went to observe swimming at the Flower of May holiday camp pool which is ideal for children trying to gain confidence. I was very impressed by the professional swimming tuition that they were getting which has resulted in 100% participation (including our most reluctant swimmers). The progress that every child has made since September has been astounding. We are also very fortunate to be able to use the

The Bay pool for the older children, which has really brought them on. We use the word 'resilience' a lot in our school and it is a feature of our children – they do not give up when challenged. A great quality to have and one I am very proud of.

EYFS Class Assembly

Knights and Princesses was the theme for the EYFS assembly today. Our Nursery and Reception children were incredibly brave to stand up and say their lines and their costumes looked fantastic too. Well done to the EYFS team for putting together a thoroughly entertaining assembly.
