Dear Parents and Families,

Welcome Back Everyone

I hope you all had a relaxing and happy time with your families this Summer. I have to say, I am feeling very optimistic about how our school improvement will continue to evolve in the 2023-24 academic year. The previous year was very busy, with a lot of work put in to improve and embed the curriculum. However, we are not complacent and recognised that further improvements to your child's curriculum was needed. As a result, we are introducing a new whole school approach to Writing called *The Write Stuff*. This is a highly structured approach, supporting children who sometimes find writing a challenge, whilst providing opportunities to stretch more able writers in school. The teachers used the Summer Term to be 'up-skilled' in this approach and it was trialled in Year 2 and Year 6 with quite dramatic results.





We are also introducing an improved Computing curriculum called *Teach Computing*, which has started this term. At the core of this is *computer science*, knowing how *digital systems* work through *programming*, using *information technology* to create programs, to ensure our pupils become *digitally literate*.

We are all looking forward to a fun, productive and healthy year ahead.

We also welcome Mrs Stuart, who will be teaching for one day in the Reception Class. We are very pleased to have Mr Tanner back with us and he is looking after Year 2 on a Thursday each week. Mrs Simpson is the new Teaching Assistant in Year 3 and Mrs Owen is the new TA in Year 4. Sadly, Mrs Shooter resigned from our staff at the start of term and we wish her well for the future. Currently, Mrs Flett is covering the TA role in Year 1 and we will be advertising for a new Teaching Assistant in due course.

Attendance and Leave of Absence

Our attendance for 2023-24 has improved from last year, although we still need to work towards our target of 96% attendance.

Monitoring from last year showed that there was an increase in children with a day off here and there, resulting in many broken weeks — unfortunately, this had a clear impact on their progress. Improved attendance continues to be one of our school's Key Priorities in our School Development Plan.

I also reiterate that the Department for Education (DfE) has made it clear that holidays in term time are not allowed and could result in a fixed penalty from the Local Authority. On occasions, parents do request a 'Leave of Absence' for their child, which can only be granted in exceptional circumstances, however, holidays are not regarded as exceptional circumstances.

The KS1 MacMillan Coffee Morning will return to school on **Friday 29**th **September at 9.30am.** We look forward to welcoming everyone, to have some delicious cake and coffee and raise funds for this very worthy cause.
