NSPCC Kindness Challenge – Mon 23rd to Fri 27th Oct

As part of developing positive relationships and supporting Safeguarding in school, we often do assemblies about friendships and how to build them and how to support them if they break down. Today is **International Smile Day**, which we talked about in Monday's assembly. We encourage you to 'smile' as well, it truly is infectious.



We want to build on this by taking part in the **NSPCC's** *Kindness Challenge* in the last week of this first half-term. We'll be spending a week creating more kindness in our school community by working through a list of kindness acts. The **School Council** and the teachers will be raising awareness of <u>acts of</u> kindness such as:

Get to know someone in your class you don't normally talk to / Be kind to yourself by doing something you love / Smile and say good morning to someone who works in your school / Hold the door open for someone / Invite someone sat on their own to join in your game / Decorate Kindness Rocks and leave them around your playground / Give positive feedback to someone in class who presents or reads something / Let your friend choose the game to play during break time ... and many more acts © .



Cashless fundraising – we would like to raise some funds for the NSPCC during the week, and we are going to use a cashless system that involves **using a QR code** on the sponsorship form. It should be easy having the QR code for our parents to add their donations and really cut down admin for the school.

We have also booked the **NSPCC** to come into school in January and deliver the 'Speak Out Stay Safe,' age appropriate workshops for our children. We have used them before to help to give children an understanding of abuse and empower them to speak out.

We will still be having a Harvest Festival Assembly in School, but will not be able to invite parents in on this occasion.
