

Ladybirds Reception Class Curriculum Newsletter- Spring 2024





Welcome back everyone! I hope you all had a wonderful Christmas and had the opportunity to recharge your batteries ready for the new term ahead.

Our Early Years Curriculum

We are continuing to follow the new 2021 Statutory Framework for the Early Years Foundation Stage and are using 'Curriculum Maestro' for our themed lessons. We continue to be 'child led' in our learning and plan activities and lessons based on children's interests.

This half term our first topic will be 'Long Ago'. This project teaches children about how they have grown and changed since they were babies and how life in the past was different from today. Our mini-topic this half term will be 'Stories and Rhymes'. This teaches children about traditional stories and rhymes and gives them the opportunity to play with words and learn new vocabulary.

Next half term we will be looking at the topic 'Animal Safari'. This project teaches children about the animals that live around the world, how to look after animals and the importance of caring for our local and global environments. Our mini topic next half term will be 'Signs of Spring'. This teaches children about the changes that happen during the spring, including weather and the festivals that are celebrated at this time of year including Easter.

Throughout the day, children are continuing to take part in short focus sessions to learn new skills:

Little Wandle Phonics

We will be moving on to learning Phase 3 phonics. This focuses on reading and writing digraphs within words (e.g. 'ai' in main and 'ee' in feet)

White Rose Maths

This term we will be focusing on consolidating numbers to 10, carrying out practical addition and learning number bonds to 10. We will also be learning about different forms of measure (length, height, mass and capacity) and looking at a range of 3D shapes

Stay and Play Communication Workshop

We are thrilled to invite you to our Stay and Play and communication workshop on **Tuesday 23rd January 10.30-11.30am**. You will have the opportunity to play with your child in their classroom, carrying out a range of fun activities and then will attend a short workshop focusing on providing the best possible start for your child regarding language and communication. A local Speech and language therapist will be leading alongside myself.

Reading/ Sharing Books

All children will come home with a fiction or non-fiction sharing book for you to enjoy with your child. In Ladybirds these are changed on a **Monday** and **Thursday** (only if your child tells us that they have had the book read to them).

Your child will also come home with a Little Wandle phonics reading book for children to read to you by sounding out and blending the words themselves. If they read the same book three times in a week and you record it in their reading records, they will get one of my very popular reading stickers! These books will be changed at the end of the week.

<u>PE</u>

This half term PE will take place on a **Friday afternoon**. Reception children will need their **full** PE kit in school every day so they are prepared for all weathers (this should include a white PE top, shorts/leggings, a hoodie/fleece, joggers and trainers/pumps).

All PE kits will be sent home at half term for you to wash.

Labelling uniform and PE kit

We would really appreciate if you could label your child's uniform and their PE kit.

This will prevent losing jumpers and cardigans and save us time at the end of the day.
