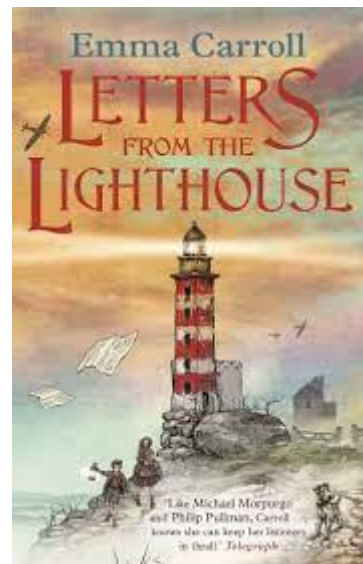


Year 6 Summer 2024 Curriculum Newsletter

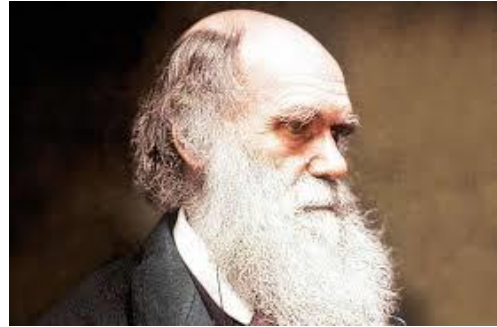
Welcome back after the Easter break. I hope the children are well rested and ready for a very busy, and very eventful, last term of the school year, and their last term with us!!!

This term we have two main topics. Firstly, we have 'Britain at War' which looks at life in Britain during World War Two. One of my favourite topics I have to say. We will be writing stories based around the Emma Carroll book 'Letters From The Lighthouse.' The children will also be sewing as part of their DT work, mending old clothes of course and we might even try some WW2 recipes. We will design and make Anderson Shelters, listen to and sing WW2 songs and pay a visit to Eden Camp.



Secondly, we have a science topic called 'Darwin's Delights' which looks at Evolution and Adaptation in the animal kingdom. We will be looking at the life of Charles Darwin, and some of his theories. We will also be updating our sketchbooks and creating a series of drawings and paintings based on some of the animals we study. The half term also includes a design and technology aspect coupled with science work on Light and Electricity, a PSHE unit called 'Me and my Relationships' and PE which includes Athletics and Summer Games.

As well as our topic work, we will have our End of Key Stage Two SATs to take in May, which the children have been working hard to prepare for, both in school and at home. We will have our weekend residential trip to East Barnby plus a day visit to Eden



Camp and Crucial Crew in Scarborough. There will also be the usual selection of end of term treats for deserving Year 6 pupils and an end of year production. A very busy term!!!

Mr Ellis will be here on a Monday as always to teach PE. Athletics and Summer Games will be the themes this term. Mrs Collier Woods will be in on a Wednesday and Friday afternoon for RE, Music, Art and French.
