Ofsted Inspection Tuesday 30th April & Wednesday 1st May

Dear Parents and Carers



As you will be aware, we had our Ofsted inspection this week. First of all, I want to thank you for your overwhelming support for your child's school. We had nearly 50 replies to Parent View, which we are grateful for and will help us move things forward.

We had a 2 day Section 5 (Graded) inspection that looked at 6 areas: **Quality of Education**, **Behaviour and Attitudes, Personal Development, EYFS** and **Leadership and Management.** There is also a final **Overall Effectiveness**. At this moment in time, we are not allowed to say what the outcomes are for those inspection areas, as Ofsted have to write up their report and get it quality assured, before sending the draft back to school for checking. This process can take a few weeks, but as soon as we can, we will send the report to you.

One thing that I can share is that Ofsted thought that our children were excellent ambassadors for the school and demonstrated politeness, kindness, excellent behaviour and respect to them, as they do to each other on a daily basis. They are a real credit to you.



Career related Learning Event

Making the curriculum real

Our aim is for our Children to be more talkative and aspired to more 'out of the box' career paths after partaking in the activities. We would hope that pupils' end of school outcomes will be raised, particularly in the STEM subjects of Science, Technology, Computing and Maths.

Interactions with employers/employees, delivers authentic experiences, and demonstrates how subjects can be applied in the world of work. It raises or broadens aspirations, and challenges their thinking about the point of education.

They need to see that they can apply what they're learning. You're not actually learning it just because it's school but there is a reason for being able to do it. You're applying Maths to be a designer, for sizes and shapes, for planning things. Being an architect, it's a bit of Maths and Art. <u>It's looking at what we're teaching them and how</u> you apply that in the real world.

What can the volunteers get out of it?

- A sense that they are making a real difference to the future aspirations of the children of Hunmanby.
- An opportunity to promote their work to potential future employees.
- Lots of tea, coffee and biscuits ☺.
